I have spent the last six years working for Essex County Council. During this time, I have gained experience across seven practice areas and progressed from caseworker to paralegal, then to graduate solicitor apprentice, and most recently to newly qualified solicitor. I therefore understand what it is like to be a junior lawyer in local government at different career stages and the challenges junior lawyers face.

Drawing on my own experience and discussions with other junior lawyers, I have identified several issues that currently affect junior members. These include navigating career progression within local government and difficulty establishing professional networks in an increasingly remote working environment. To help address these issues, I would explore the introduction of the following initiatives:

- LLG junior mentor scheme - pairing junior lawyers with senior practitioners to support career development, confidence building and cross-authority collaboration.
- Networking skills workshops - offering practical tools to help junior members develop confidence when networking in person and online.
- Biannual in person junior lawyer meet ups - creating opportunities for peer connection, shared learning and relationship building across authorities, and helping junior members develop a stronger shared identity.

I have a strong track record of representing my peers and helping to bring about meaningful change. Throughout university and my graduate solicitor apprenticeship, I served as a student representative, study abroad ambassador and SQE cohort representative. In these roles, I listened to concerns, gathered feedback and made suggestions to improve service delivery. For example, as cohort representative, I identified that many online learners felt isolated. In response to this, I proposed the implementation of a buddy system to reduce isolation. I want to bring this same



member-focused and solution-orientated approach to representing junior lawyers within LLG.

I am committed to a career in local government and to supporting junior lawyers within it. I have experience presenting to students, coordinating work experience sessions, and succeeding in public speaking and advocacy competitions. If elected, I will use these skills to deliver engaging workshops, represent you effectively and advocate for useful, practical opportunities for your development.
